Two Class Levels

To ensure personalised learning and comfortable progression, participants are placed into one of two levels:

Class A — Beginner to Intermediate (A1–B1)

Designed for learners developing vocabulary, grammar and confidence in everyday communication.

Class B — Intermediate to Advanced (B1–C1)

Designed for learners seeking greater fluency, academic English and professional communication skills.

Maximum 20 Students Per Class

Small-group teaching ensures personalised feedback and a stronger learning experience.

Level Placement

Participants select their English level during registration. Those unsure can complete a short online placement assessment.

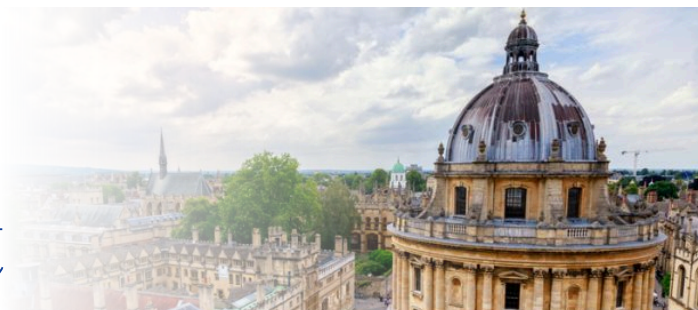

Bodleian Libraries & Radcliffe Camera Access

Participants will receive a Bodleian Libraries reader card with induction access to Oxford's historic library system, including the iconic Radcliffe Camera reading rooms — spaces typically reserved for Oxford students and academic researchers, making this a distinctive part of the Oxford Summer Academy experience.



Living Inside an Oxford College: Lincoln College

Participants will be staying in private ensuite single rooms located directly within Lincoln College, one of Oxford's most picturesque colleges, situated in the heart of the city centre. Used by Oxford students during term time, the accommodation offers an authentic experience of daily Oxford student life within walking distance of the university's iconic Radcliffe Camera and other colleges.

During your time at Lincoln College, you will be able to experience a traditional Oxford formal dinner served in Lincoln College's own historic dining hall, following customs and atmosphere of authentic Oxford college life. 2. Receive Admission Decision

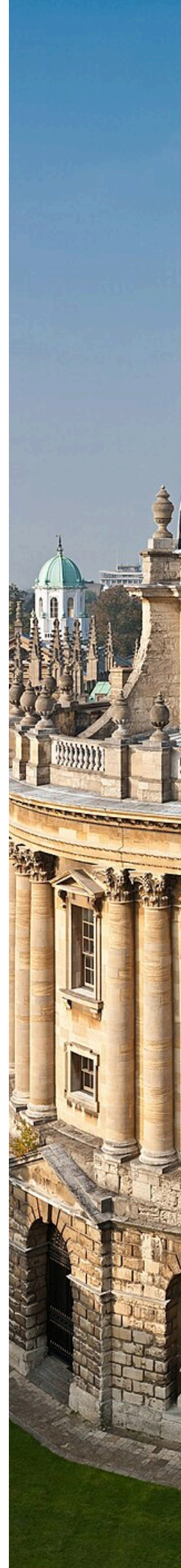
Successful applicants will receive an official offer notification.
